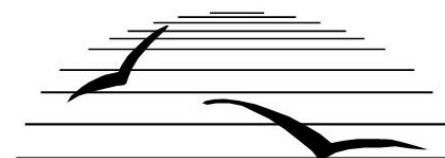

Car Rental



Get the most from your car rental experience. Make sure your rental car will meet your travel needs for cargo space, number of people traveling, etc.

Vacation Packages

Vacation Packages often involve a destination far away from home with multiple methods of transportation.

Be prepared with what you need ahead of time to accommodate your family's special needs. Some things you might want to keep on hand are snacks, wipes, and bottled water or juice.

Passports



Make sure you have your Passport or Visa up-to-date. Carry these documents on your person rather than in luggage.

Report a Passport Lost or Stolen in the U.S. by phone at (877) 487-2778. Operators are available 8 a.m.-10 p.m. ET, Monday-Friday excluding Federal holidays. Then file a written report. The form is available on the AHT Web site.

For **overseas** help with a lost or stolen passport, **contact the nearest U.S. Embassy or Consulate.**

Luggage

3-1-1 for Carry-ons

3-1-1 is for short trips. If in doubt, put your liquids in checked luggage.

- 3.4 ounce bottle or less (by volume)
- 1 quart-sized, clear, plastic, zip-top bag
- 1 bag per passenger placed in screening bin.

One-quart bag per person limits the total liquid volume each traveler can bring. 3.4 oz. container size is a security measure.

Consolidate bottles into one bag and X-ray separately to speed screening.

Be prepared. Each time TSA searches a carry-on it slows down the line. Practicing 3-1-1 will ensure a faster and easier checkpoint experience.

Declare larger liquids. Medications, baby formula & food, and breast milk are allowed in reasonable quantities exceeding three ounces and are not required to be in the zip-top bag. Declare these items for inspection at the checkpoint.

Come early and be patient. Heavy travel volumes and the enhanced security process may mean longer lines at security checkpoints. TSA works with airlines and airports to anticipate peak traffic and be ready for the traveling public.
